FAREWELL OF RETIRED STAFF AT DAVID GORDON HOSPITAL

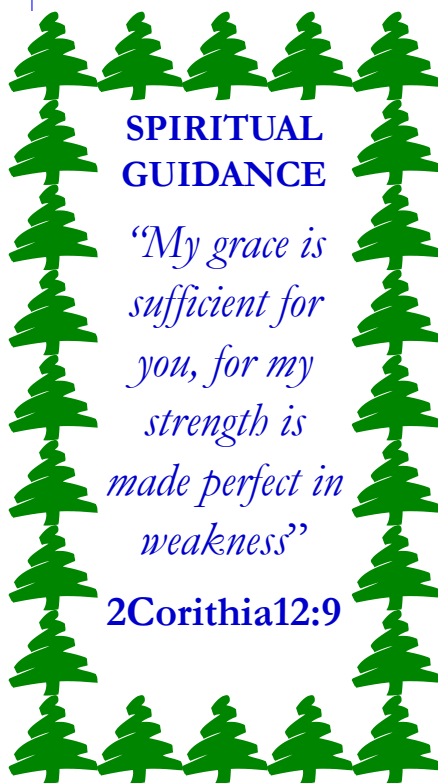
