This occurred in the night of 21st April 2019 when heavy rains poured for three days nonstop. This rendered 10 households homeless, some 7 people are missing. Francis Zakazaka, DGM hospital Boatman from Traditional Authority Chapinduka in Rumphi district lost his wife and daughter, mother and brother. This brother lost a wife and two children in the same incident DGM hospital positively responded to the catastrophe in effort to assist in alleviating the plight of people affected by the disaster ,distributed food and non food items to the 10 displaced families at Tcharo..Some lost life and property during the disaster. DGM hospital cheered the victims and donated clothes ,foodstuffs among others. More support is needed.
