DGMH MEMBERS OF STAFFS DRILLED ON COVID 19

- DGM Hospital members of staff have received trainings on Covid-19.Two trainings were conducted. The first session targeted Clinicians and nurses. The training aimed at equipping clinical and nursing staff with knowledge and skills of how to handle and manage COVID-19 cases.
- ♦ The training was conducted courtesy of Rumphi District hospital with financial support from International Center for AIDS Care and treatment programs (ICAP.) The second session targeted drivers, watchmen, patient attendants, Mortuary attendant, and hospital messenger. The training was courtesy of Livingstonia Synod health coordination Office with financial assistance from development partners.
- Hospital management commended Livingstonia Synod Health Coordination Office and Rumphi DHO for the training sessions saying it has equipped the hospital workers with knowledge of Covid-19 as it recognizes the serious threat that the on going Covid-19 global outbreak poses to Malawi.


COVID 19 CASE AT THE HOSPITAL

♦ The hospital registered one COVID-19 case. A man of 50 years old .He was a fisherman. He came from lake shore district of Nkhatabay. The patient was first seen by a clinician who suspected him of being infected with COVID -19.The clinician instructed Male ward staffs to isolate the patient. The patient was put in isolation ward. Sample was collected the following day and tested positive COVID -19.The patient died day five in the ward. All male ward staffs who attended to the patient were quarantined for five days. The hospital arranged for Male ward staffs to go for testing and were confirmed

NON COMMUNICABLE DISEASE CLINIC

♦ Routine NCD (non communicable disease) clinic continued to be carried out at DGMH twice a month. NCD includes diabetes, hypertension, Asthma, mentally challenged and Epilepsy . Patients are checked blood sugar levels, blood pressure .Epilepsy patients are asked how many seizures has he or she had per two weeks The clinic has over 200 patients who are benefiting from the service. Non communicable diseases are highest cause of death among elderly in Malawi . High blood pressure is usually called the silent killer. The Clinic is run by NCD coordinator, Mr. Eden Kumwenda



- Dispenses prescription medication and other medical products to patients under direction of the prescriber.
- ◆ Counts pills, labels bottles, prices, and compounds medications to prepare prescriptions for patients as directed.
- Gathers, organizes, and assesses patient information, Supplies patients with information and education on their prescriptions, Monitors prescription-filling process to ensure compliance with relevant regulations and pharmacy policies, Liaises with healthcare providers and patients to obtain correct prescription information, Answers patients' questions about their medications under the supervision of the pharmacist, Takes inventory of drugs on hand and records results, Places orders for additional drugs as directed by the pharmacist.
